INTRODUCTION/ COURSE OVERVIEW

The **2nd International Security Intelligence Course** is the second International series of our Professional Security Intelligence Course. This year, it will be held in 2 different cities in Australia.

This challenging and informative course has been specifically designed for those persons working in an environment where receiving and interpreting correct information and maintaining clear communications is vital to the safety and security of their company or infrastructure.

This is **a hands-on practical course** where delegates will be required to attend various locations both in and around the City to gather information. Delegates will visit challenging remote locations where clear thinking and good team work is vital to achieving the objective.

Delegates will learn how to interpret situations and ensure that all relevant information is gathered and assessed before important decisions are made.

Across the world, there are too many past examples of Supervisors, Managers and Senior Executives making decisions before all the information is gathered and assessed. This can result in a manageable situation very quickly escalating into an unmanageable situation.

Highly experienced instructors will guide delegates from one scenario to another encouraging each team to use all their existing and newly acquired knowledge to gather, assess and act upon the information that they obtain.

OBJECTIVES

This course will provide delegates with the skills to be able to professionally gather information and evidence from a variety of sources in different locations that will allow them to act swiftly to reduce or avert a possible threat to their organisation or company.

The course clearly shows you how to reduce threats to your company or infrastructure by giving you the training to identify any threat before it escalates.

SCENARIO 1

We always hear after any major event or damaging incident that someone knew something prior to the event. In the **recent Mumbai terrorist incident** it became clear after many people died and were injured that there had been clear indications that something was about to happen yet authorities were totally unprepared.

If you don't know how to identify that **someone is leaking information** to your competitors, then how can you put procedures into place to prevent this from occurring.

COURSE CONTENT

DAY1 THEORY

The day commences at the ASSI state of the art training centre where delegates will receive instruction in the following areas.

- Understanding Cultures and People
- Transport Systems
- Operating a Mobile GPS
- Investigation Techniques
- Interview and Statement Taking
- Security Operations
- Information and Intelligence Gathering
- Setting up a Wireless Intelligence Transfer Link
- Managing Informants
- Team Leadership

- Setting up a Basic CCTV Post
- Surveillance Techniques
- Digital Photography

- Report Writing

DAY2 BRIEFING, PLANNING & RECONNAISSANCE

Delegates will be divided in to small manageable teams and will be provided with a briefing in regards to a security threat against a fictitious company that they represent.

The threat requires the teams to work both separately and together to plan a strategy by conducting inquiries through using the internet, phones and other medium to gather further information in relation to the threat which will lead them to attending various locations. At these locations they may be required to:

- Speak with Informants
- Conduct surveys
- Record and Gather Evidence
- Take Photographs
- Interview Witnesses
- Gather Intelligence by Covert Means

All the locations have different challenges which need both a tactical and strategic approach by the delegates so that the maximum amount of information can be gathered and assessed. The exercise is designed so that delegates can approach a situation with an open mind and take in all the information they have and then gather what they do not have before they act.

DAY3 TECHNICAL COMMUNICATIONS

Teams will continue to gather, interpret, assess and act upon information by attending various locations. These locations will be identified through the intelligence the teams have gathered during the previous day.

In a specialist section of the course, each team will be required to transfer information between each other by using wireless ADSL and data links. Instruction will be provided on the first day in how to set up these networks and ensure that the data sent is encrypted, manageable and readable.

Delegates will be instructed on how to record video and sometimes voice and then using propriety software, transfer that video and audio to another team so that they can act upon the information received. Teams will also receive instruction on how to setup basic Internet Protocol (IP) Networks.

WHY THIS COURSE

The International Security Intelligence Course is one of the most comprehensive intelligence gathering courses currently available and requires participants to work in many diverse and challenging environments within Australia.

This course is designed for those persons who are required as part of their employment to collect, analyse and act upon information that may effect their company or industry operations.

Oil & Gas, Utilities, Ports, Airports, Hotels, Government buildings, Tourist Attractions and other industry may be at risk of industrial espionage, terrorist events, dishonesty of staff, threats to infrastructure and personnel, hostage situations and any similar events where lack of information and intelligence is a concern.

COURSE CONTENT

DAY 4 TEAMWORK - EMERGENCY PLANNING

Teams will continue to gather, interpret, assess and act upon information by attending various locations. These locations will be identified through the intelligence the teams have gathered during the previous day.

A planned and controlled emergency situation will arise during the day where teams need to respond to different locations but remain in contact with each other to co-ordinate a response.

This scenario will require teams to use all the skills and training they have acquired over the past 4 days.

The days training will clearly demonstrate the need for proper and professional co-ordination to occur to manage an emergency situation and teams will instinctively refer to this training in their own work environment when emergency situations occur.

DAYS 5 COMPILING & PRESENTING REPORTS - DEBRIEF

Preparing and presenting briefings and de-briefings is without doubt one of the most important roles of a manager or supervisor.

Over the previous 4 days, teams will have visited a diverse range of locations and spoken to numerous persons both directly and indirectly. A great deal of information would have been gathered.

Each team is required to provide a debriefing to the course managers on their teams activities and some of the positive and negative aspects of each days activities.

This day is dedicated to having delegates provide information to others in a clear and informed manner. This is the key to ensuring that Senior Management within their own company can be briefed and de-briefed adequately on important events.

During this day teams will clearly understand how much they have learnt from the training and how they will be able to react with more professionalism and in a more responsive and effective manner when information is provided to them in their own work environment.

This could be from a security threat, emergency, terrorist attack, natural disaster or simply some information that they have heard from an employee.

TRAINING SCENARIO

In one of the many scenarios conducted throughout the training course, the team is provided information about a particular person who is staying at a hotel located in a small town located just outside Sydney/Perth. This person has information in regards to a threat against the team's company but is reluctant to speak with anyone official as he fears for his safety.

The team under guidance from instructors must develop a strategy to attend the hotel and using skills they are taught, speak with the informant and obtain as much information as they can which will then lead them to the next event they must deal with.

NETWORKING OPPORTUNITIES

This is a rare opportunity to work with delegates from around the world in a practical training environment. The networking value of this training cannot be underestimated and delegates will work closely with each other learning new strategies and techniques which will further add to the protection of your people and assets.

LOCATIONS

The course requires delegates to attend various locations in an around the City where the course is being conducted. Operation will occur both during the day and the evening.

Delegates may in the morning be required to visit a small town in the Australian outback to speak with a witness and then return to the City to take a series of photographs of a vehicle that they may later have to observe to identify an informant.

IMPORTANT NOTE

This is not a classroom-based course. It is a full hands on practical based course where delegates will be first provided with basic information about a threat against a fictitious company they are working for.

The delegates will then have to work closely together as a team to develop strategies both tactical and strategic to gather further intelligence about the threat with a view to taking appropriate action to reduce or negate that threat.
